

















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HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

The origin of Maharani Kasiswari College may be linked to the great love for education and learning of the Cossimbazar Royal Family of Murshidabad. Starting from Krishna Kanta Nandy, great - grandson of Kalinath Nandy (founder of Cossimbazar Estate) to Raja Harinath (grandson of 'Kanta Babu'), Raja Krishnath

(son of Harinath), Swarnamoyee (wife of Maharaja Manindra (nephew of Maharani Maharaja Sris Chandra Chandra Nandy) - all wealth towards the cause Bengal. Establishment of Krishnath College of Duffrin Medical Hostel of other schools and examples of their promotion of education

This college building at 20, Ramkanto Bose Street, Shyambazar, was an ancestral property of Maharaja Manindra Nandy. In this house, he was born on 29th May, 1860 and was married to Maharani Kasiswari of Burdwan when He was seventeen and the Bride was only seven. In 1897, Manindra Chandra left Kolkata for Cossimbazar Estate.

After the demise of Manindra Chandra, Maharaja Sris Chandra donated their house for setting up of a College in that premises. The mission was made possible through immense initiative of some spirited persons of North Kolkata at that time. On 15th July, 1941 Maharaja Manidra Chandra College was established. From 1st October, 1947, a morning section of the College was opened to meet the aspirations of the neighbourhood girls for education. Maharani Kasiswari College came into existence when in 1964, according to the direction of UGC, Manindra Chandra College was split up into three units - Morning, Day and Evening, with separate affiliations under CU. The Morning section, meant exclusively for Girl students, started functioning from 2nd December, 1964 and was named as Maharani Kasiswari College, to perpetuate the memory of Maharani Kasiswari, who once entered this house as a 7 year old bride. Since its inception, the college believes in the idea that Education Empowers Women - psychologically, economically, politically and socially at the levels of Family, Community, Society, National and International.

ONLINE LEARNING STRATEGIES

The current pandemic crisis caused by the global spread of Covid-19 and its multiple variants has thrown up a lot of challenges for the education sector. Traditional methods of campus learning had to be radically changed in view of the sudden closure of school, colleges and universities. E-learning was in place in Maharani Kasiswari College even in pre-pandemic times as ICT based teaching modes and usage of digital classrooms were some of the ways in which digital learning was being promoted in offline classes. But online classes became the order of the day as the college and its stakeholders adopted online learning modes, computer-mediated learning and web-based templates to create a successful network of delivery system.

Synchronous learning methods using various real-time communication platforms such as Zoom, Skype, Google-meet helped create a structured routine-based class lecture system. Overcoming initial bottlenecks such as difficulty in choice of a mutually convenient platform, weak connectivity issues for students and slow pace of adjustment to the new method of teaching, Maharani Kasiswari College successfully built its digital capital and ensured inclusivity for all sections of students. Currently most departments hold structured classes on Google-meet to ensure that students can access classes on their mobiles and devices other than laptops and also because this platform offers a larger participant base and is more user friendly. This has allowed for prompt feedback from students and interactive sessions across the digital screen. The digital connect through virtual classroom has also used asynchronous methods such as uploading of materials on Google-classroom, posting of files in Whatsapp groups, sending YouTube links which students can access at a convenient time from the comfort of their homes. Such delivery methods are based on the idea of digital inclusivity for those students who have weak internet connections, insufficient bandwidths and low affordability for high-value data packages. Departments also adjust routines to allow students break from the monotony of constant exposure to the electronic screen.

Departments also upload e-books, articles, recordings of audio-video lectures and links to other legal openaccess resources onto the college website. This allows students to participate in a continual, fluid, readily accessible virtual classroom beyond the scheduled hours.

The college **Research Cell** has collaborated with the **IQAC** to conduct a series of **departmental webinars** on topics related to the syllabus. The webinar format made it possible to organize lectures by academic luminaries and eminent life-skill experts. Students responded with great enthusiasm by participating in such departmental events by making digital posters, participating as moderators, real-timeperformers; experimenting with the various templates of electronic presentations.

Students also spontaneously celebrated online Rabindra Jayanti, Independence Day, Food and Nutrition Week, The 'Ismat Chughtai' Week and other cultural programmes electronically. They uploaded videos and audios and reached a wider audience.

The radical transitioning from blended modes to e-learning methodology highlighted some deeper issues such as digital-divide and a few initial teething problems regarding security issues in certain platforms. But Maharani Kasiswari College administration, its teaching community, its library staff and its non-teaching staff updated their skill-base promptly adapting to the web-based technology to bring about

ONLINE ORIENTATION PROGRAMME FOR NEW ENTRANTS: ACADEMIC SESSION 2020-21

Subsequent to the successful completion of the process of admission to the undergraduate courses, at the beginning of every academic session, Maharani Kasiswari College conducts an orientation programme for all the new entrants institutions to control the spread of Covid-19, the college organized an e-Orientation session. - ☐ In her address, the Principal offered the students a clear road map to navigate the transitional zone between higher secondary education and the university affiliated undergraduate courses. She familiarized the students with the values, the history and the vision and mission of the college.
- □ Prof. Sunanda Mukherjee (Associate Professor and HoD, Economics) meticulously introduced the details of the CBCS and laid down the ground rules of discipline and other regulations.
- ☐ This was followed by a formal introduction to all faculty members.
- □ All HoDs unmuted their audios and appeared on screen with departmental colleagues, introducing the latter to the new students. This was done to give student a sense of electronic-campus community and to offer an idea of the range of digital platforms and tools in use in the college.

ATTENDANCE

In CBCS, Regular Attendance in class is a must. For each course studied by one student, there will be Mark on her Attendence in classes, which will be added in Final Semester Examination.

Students with less attendance will have to face loss of semester.

Attendance in a subject shall be counted from the date of commencement of classes. All the Guardians are requested to be very careful about their wards in connection with attendance.

Transfer:

One month's notice is required for seeking transfer. Students seeking transfer in the midst of a session are liable to pay all annual charges (including annual session charges) in full in addition to the transfer fee. Application for transfer certificate must be signed by both guardian and student.

Change of Address:

Students must promptly intimate in writing to the Principal any change of address during their period of study in the College. The College does not accept any responsibility for delivery of letters etc., to students through the College address.

RULES AND DISCIPLINE

Every student must obey the following rules and discipline of the college.

- 1) Use of cell-phones in Class-rooms, Library or Examination Hall is strictly prohibited. In Examination Hall, Students will not even keep phones with themselves.
- 2) Students have to ensure 75% attendance in each subject. It attendance falls below 60%, that student may not be 'Allowed' to sit for Final Examination.
- 3) Students should Bring Identity Cards along with them everyday.
- 4) They must not be absent in any Test and reach the examination hall at least 5 minutes before examination time. Students who will reach Examination Hall after 15 minutes or more from commencement of exam, will not be allowed to enter the Hall.
- 5) Students must secure the suggested text-books immediately as classes start, without making delay. Coming to college without having specific books, will be a sheer futile act on their part.
- 6) They are required to maintain strict Silence in the Library and obey the rules regarding use of library books.
- 7) Students should regularly See the Notice Board for any important notice before leaving the college.
- 8) Students must Not Assemble or Loiter in front of class-room or staff-room during College hours.
- Any kind of Misbehaviour with Teachers or Employees or Fellow Student will Not be excused.

Following actions of students will be considered as offences against college discipline:

- i) Talking in class when lectures are being delivered (ii) Impersonation at roll call (iii) Loitering in the corridors (iv) Sitting on staircase
- v) Keeping any book/written paperwith herself during examination
- vi) Breach of rules regarding use of common room
- vii) Noisy conduct inside college premises or near the college gate viii) Damaging ordefacing college property
- ix) Sticking posters on college walls
- x) Leaving college premises during ofF periods without permission of the Principal.

Serious notice will be taken of any breach of discipline and gross misconduct may be punished by immediate expulsion.

Statutory warning under the West Bengal Prohibition of Ragging in Education Institutions Act. 2000


PAYMENT OF FEES

STIPENDS AND CONCESSIONS




















CELEBRATION OF VIDYASAGAR BICENTENARY by Maharani Kasiswari College

Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar, the harbinger of modern thinking and education in Bengal, was not only an accomplished academician but was a man par excellence in humanity. The year 2020 was the birth bi-centenary of this glorious human being and the celebrations for the same started way back in 2019 all over the state and the country as well. And why not? For he was the man who was the pioneer of the modern Bengali language and did a lot of good work for the society, especially the neglected women.

The students, teachers and the entire family of Maharani Kasiswari College also joined in this celebration and organized various unique programs to pay their respect to Vidyasagar. There was a grand commencement of the programme with a massive procession from the College premises to "Vidyasagar -bati", his abode during his lifetime. The procession was a one- of- its- kind with lovely banners depicting slogans that included quotes from his books, his teachings, photographs from the annals of history and much more. The mood was set with lovely, inspirational songs sung by the teachers and students of the college and a bold rally marked the dawn of the 200th year of the great Bengali. SEMESTER-WISE THREE - YEAR COURSES OF STUDIES Introduced From Academic Session 2018 -19, C.U.

University of Calcutta has introduced Semester-wise Three - year Honours / General / Major courses of Studies under CBCS, from academic session, 2018 -19. In this system, one Academic Year of study will be the sum of two semesters.

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e.g. First year of study = Semester 1 + Semester 2
Second year of study = Semester 3 + Semester 4
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Third year of study = Semester 5 + Semester 6

FACILITIES

• IDENTITY CARD:

Each Student is provided with an I-Card. This card is to be carried always. If it is lost, it must be informed to the office immediately. A new card may be issued on payment of fees. In case of transfer from the college, student must return the card to the college office.

• LIBRARY:

The College has well-stocked libraries with spacious Reading Room attached to those. The college has two libraries-

1.Central Library (for Literature and Arts books)2.GYANDHARA (for Science and Commerce books)

Students may borrow books from the library without any charge or deposit for use



in the Reading Room during college hours; but they must not remove these books from the Library and must return them on the same day, failing which they will be fined for the extra days. Books taken out for home study must be returned within 14 days. Students failing to do so are liable to be fined and no book will be issued to them again without the

permission of the librarian. Honors students, are permitted to borrow three volumes and general students can borrow two volumes at a time and to retain them for a

period not exceeding 14 days. Reference books, textbooks and rare books are not issued to them and if any volume is lost or damaged while in possession of the borrower, it will have to be replaced at her expense. Library Cards which entitle holders to use the library are not transferable. A fee will be charged for a duplicate card if the original



card is lost. All students have open access to library book stack.

• Library Collections :

The library has approximately 31,000 volumes and subscribes to more than 15 journals and periodicals to cater various academic needs of the users. Library also subscribes NLIST program through which users can have access to more than 5000 e-journals and more than 3 lakhs e-books. Library also provides DELNET services for inter-library loan.

• GENERAL LENDING RULES :

- 1. Users must produce their valid library card when borrowing the books. Users must check to see that all library materials in their possession have been properly checked out to them before leaving the library.
- 2. Users will be held responsible for any mutilation (including defacement) found in library materials when returned. Users must report the loss of library materials immediately to the concerned personnel of the Library.
- 3. Each student must give attendance after entering into the library. Usage of mobile is strictly prohibited in library premises.
- 4. Users must ensure that the books issued to them are returned or renewed on or before the date due. Renewal is permitted for twice only after returning the same. Rs. 1/- per day for each book would be fined after due date.

• SEMINAR LIBRARY:

Each Department maintains a seminar library, an additional facility for the Honours students to borrow books.

NSS BOOK BANK :

Under the supervision of NSS a second independent Book Bank Unit is run, formed by regular contribution from faculty members. This facility has been extremely useful for the students of the college as this is an additional source (apart from the Central Library) of books for poor students, for the entire academic year.

CULTURAL COMPETITION

Every year cultural and literary competitions among the students are arranged in the College. • STUDENTS' CAREER DEVELOPMENT AND PLACEMENT COUNSELLING:

There is an arrangement for career development and placement of students through Students' Career Development and Placement Counselling Committee. There is regular display of information about seminars, workshops, employment opportunities on college notice board. Seminars, workshops and campus drives are arranged by reputed professional organizations like ICA, NUT, Aptec, Globsyn Business School, Dreamzone, Amazon, Tibet Tours and Travels, Avisari Holidays, Wheels and Wings, Pathfinder, ICICI Foundation, International School of Design etc. to provide knowledge about various career opportunities and to increase interview facing skills of students. Another add-on advantage for students is the availability of important and necessary books, newspapers, magazines and study materials to get prepared for different competitive examinations of the Central Govt, and the State Govt. This college has a tie up with WEBEL Technology Ltd. (A Govt, of West Bengal Undertaking) to provide computer literacy and training programme for the college students. In the last session (from July 2018 to May 2019), nearly 20 students of the college have been placed in different sectors/organisations.

FUTURE PLANS:


